

<u>CHARACTER</u> – the personality or part an actor represents in the drama





<u>LANGUAGE/DICTION</u> – how the characters express themselves through the words – pronunciation, accentuation, rhythm and melody of the words

Lizard's leg and howlet's wing,


For a charm of powerful trouble,
