You are being asked to breathe life into the residents of Spoon River through a performance of ONE monologue.

THE TASK -

- 1. Choose ONE *Spoon River* monologue that you find interesting, intriguing, relatable, etc.
 - a. Prepare a FULL ANALYSIS of the poem
 - i. ANNOTATION of your chosen poem
 - 1. Definitions/Allusions
 - 2. Rhetoric
 - 3. Asking questions of the text
 - 4. Inferences
 - ii. Identification of a UNVERSAL (what Masters is saying about 'the life of man everywhere')
 - iii. Character description
 - iv. Choice of PORTRAIT (from the bank of images provided on the class webpage)
 - v. Identification of a PROP that would be appropriate for the character
 - vi. Identification of THREE emotions that would be appropriate for the character
 - b. Prepare a PERFORMANCE of the poem with the following
 - i. Full and accurate memorization of the poem
 - ii. **Vocal expression,** appropriate to the character and in service of the message
 - iii. Physical expression, appropriate to the character and in service of the message
 - iv. Specific performance **location** that helps to convey your message
 - v. Use of a **prop** appropriate to the character and in service of the message
 - vi. An **emotional life** appropriate to the character and in service of the message
 - c. Create a SHORT FILM of your performance. The short film should include
 - i. Your analysis
 - 1. written or spoken
 - ii. Your performance
 - iii. Reflection
 - 1. written or spoken
 - d. EXTRA CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES
 - i. Going above and beyond the requirements in any way, shape, or form will earn you extra credit on a sliding scale. Be creative!
