A DOCUMENTARY FILM -

depicts news events, social conditions, etc. in nonfictional but dramatic form

A DOCUMENTARY FILMMAKER -

"an historical actor bent upon communicating a message" consciously persuading telling a story communicating their views

WHAT SUBJECT MATTER IS BEING PORTRAYED?

Events Places Conditions - (social, emotional, physical, psychological) Beliefs

WITH WHAT TECHNIQUES IS THE SUBJECT MATTER BEING PORTRAYED?

<u>direct cinema</u> – people filmed in uncontrolled situations, usually no added music or narration <u>reenactment</u> – events staged by actors

<u>archival footage</u> – documentary footage or photos from past to set context or reinforce an idea

point of view shot – seeing a scene from one of the subjects point of view;

allows audience to identify with subject

direct interview - we see/hear interviewer asking questions and we see subject responding

indirect interview – we see/hear subject but not interviewer

voiceover narration – we hear the speaker but do not see them

direct narration - we see and hear the narrator

graphics – titles or other written information

music - sound within or through scenes

reaction shot - close-up of person right after significant action so we can see their reaction

insert close-up - draws our attentions and facilitates our judgment

symbolic placement of objects – placing an object deliberately in a shot to suggest an interpretation
